POLICY - The two following policy resolutions were passed by the members at the recent Nominating Convention:

1. TENANT ELECTORS: TEAM should work for the necessary amendments to existing legislation so as to provide for the right of resident-electors and tenant-electors to vote on all matters including money by-laws.
2. RECREATION: TEAM endorses the following recreation policies:  
THAT: Greater emphasis within the Board of Parks and Public Recreation should be given to recreation and community programs; recreation policies must be extended to include many new types of 'community programs' in addition to traditional recreation programs; long range goals should include a major review of the Board of Parks and Recreation and its relationship to City Council and the School Board.
